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Game Summary:

Tommy Guns wins their second straight game to book their spot in the Finals. Mike O'Neill steps up his offense production as he makes his goals count when they matter most, with his team trailing by two goals in the last minute, he scores both goals to pull them back from the brink of a loss to send the game into overtime with a stunning finish.
