Game Summary:

Hammertime plays one of their best team games all season as they twice comeback from one-goal deficits, scoring twice late in the third period, then win it in overtime, stunning their opponent. By winning the game, Hammertime finally climbs out of the cellar.

Dominions falls behind by two goals in the first period, takes the lead at the start of the third period and has the edge in play but loses in overtime in a physical well played game by both teams.

Johnathan Cafarella comes out of the penalty box in overtime and scores the game winner on a bang-bang play at the crease.

Patrick Spencer makes some big plays as a playmaker, with 2-assists (setting up the game winning goal in overtime on a heads up hustle play), and scores a big tying goal in the third period.

Lee Nogler makes it count when needed in the third period, with his team down a goal, scoring with only thirty-three seconds left in the game, while setting up a big tying goal earlier.

Dominic Defrancisco scores 2-goals, his first to ignite his team's comeback in the second period, while his second goal scored gives his team the lead with a minute and a half to play in the game.

Manny Nunes continues to have a "quiet" impact for his team as the playmaker, setting up three goals, as he has his third straight multipoint game.

Rich Pelletier extends his multipoint scoring streak to four games, with 1-goal and 1-assist.

Goalie Dale McIsaac is under barrage all game facing a swarming attack by the opponent, and comes up with multiple big saves in the third period and especially in overtime, to give his team a chance for the win!
